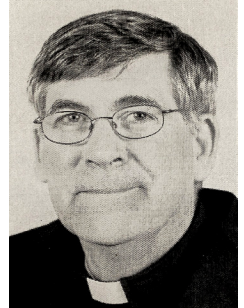

- This calls us to social justice to service those in need and to work together for God and one another



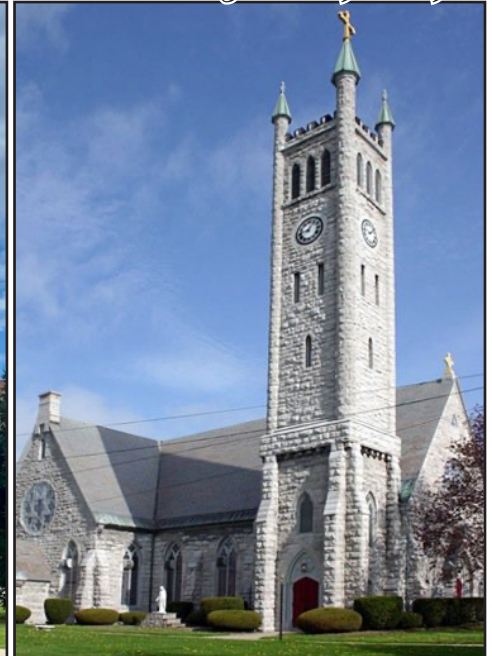

Parish Financial Statement for 2023-2024

The insert in this week's bulletin is the Year End Financial Statement for our last fiscal year, July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024. All things considered, I would say that we had a good year due to your continued support of our parish and its activities. The net income was about 30% ahead of last year's numbers. The net operational income shows that we are able to pay our operational bills.

The non-operational numbers look very good this year, mostly due to the stock market doing fairly well, however, the Catholic Ministries Appeal went very well this year with the highest total yet. We also received a grant of over \$6,000 from the Diocese of Rochester that led to us paying only \$14,005 in shortfall money. It's amazing how well our numbers do when the CMA goal comes closer to being realized. I hope that we can continue to make our CMA goal for the next campaign that starts shortly. The Diocese is conducting a diocesan wide census to help parishes update their records so that we can have accurate data so that more people can share in contributing to the CMA.

The Festival Raffle made over \$41,000 this year with the rest of the festival making approximately \$11,818 (which includes the cost of the new set up), for a total profit of \$53,607 Our collections are doing well with a 4.6% increase over last year, which is quite positive in that we have consistently seen decreases. We have a very financially healthy parish.

I am very proud of our parish and all its parishioners. Due to your faithful support, we can maintain a parish that continues to spread the Good News of the Gospel by word and deed. Many Thanks!



1 NEW YORK ALREADY HAS TOO MUCH ABORTION.

New York currently has one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world, permitting abortions up to birth, allowing non-physicians to perform abortions, and excluding parents from the decision-making process. By making “reproductive healthcare” a constitutional right, it would be impossible to pass even the most limited restrictions to protect women and children, and would further threaten the conscience rights of health professionals and institutions that refuse to take unborn life by abortion.

2 CHILDREN SHOULDN'T MAKE LIFE-ALTERING MEDICAL DECISIONS WITHOUT PARENTAL CONSENT.

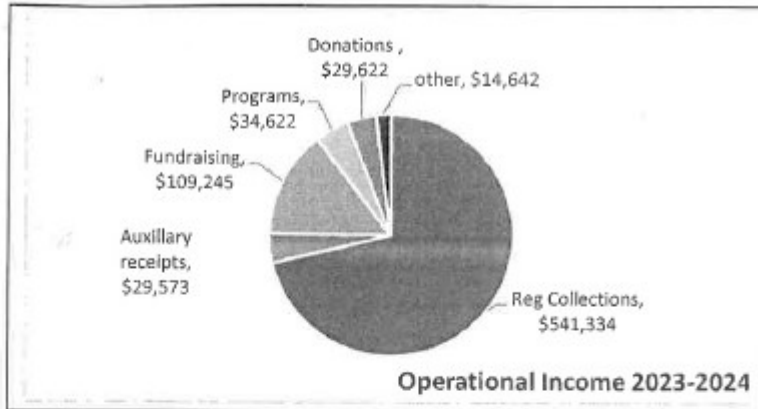
Confusion about gender has become an epidemic among young people. But gender reassignment therapies and surgeries have serious life-long consequences, and their safety and benefit are increasingly questioned, even by secular researchers. “Gender-affirming care” is based in ideologies that do not recognize the true nature of human sexuality and often these ‘treatments’ fail to adequately address underlying mental health struggles. This amendment would permit troubled children to seek these dangerous procedures without parental consent or even knowledge, excluding from the conversation those who know them best and desire their true good.

3 AGE RESTRICTIONS MAKE A LOT OF SENSE.

Laws “discriminate” based on age all the time. For the protection of vulnerable youth, we set minimum ages to drive, smoke, drink, or consent to sexual activity. To prevent elder abuse, we provide special privileges and protections to those over 65. This so-called new constitutional “protection” would make it much easier for activists to overturn these common-sense safeguards. Age restrictions that relate to “sexual freedom” or “the right to die” are those that would be most likely to be challenged. Some countries already permit children as young as 12 to consent to assisted suicide or euthanasia, which could soon be legalized in New York. We want to ensure that appropriate protections remain in place for vulnerable age groups.

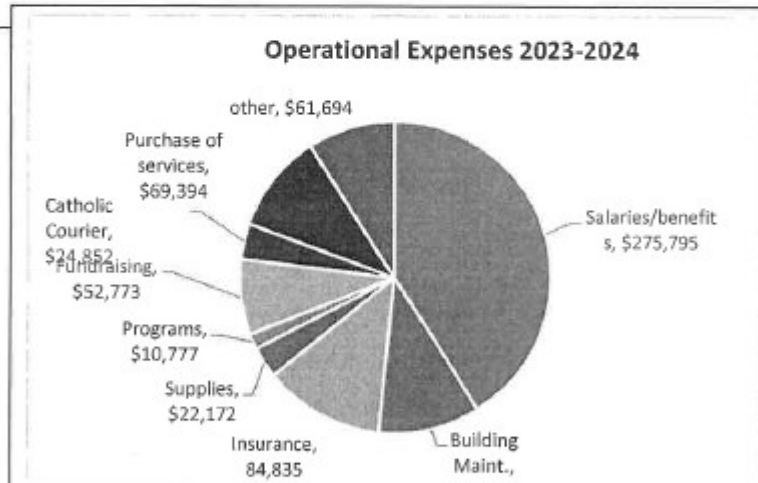
The regular collection-consists of weekly envelopes, plate, and parish second collections and online giving. Collections were almost even from last year.

Auxiliary receipts includes memorials, candles, carillon bells and flowers. These receipts were down 6.6% from last year.

Fundraising income is the total income from, Festival, Summer Raffle Christmas Bazaar, and St. Pauly shed. The net fundraising amt was up almost 50 % mostly due to restarting the festival

Program revenue is from sacramental programs and adult education.

Donations are both restricted and unrestricted funds.



Operational expense is the expenses that occurs in the everyday operation of the church. Our expenses were up about 3% this year.

Salaries and benefits

Fundraising expenses include all the money paid out to winners of the raffles as well as all other expense to run the fundraisers.

Catholic Courier- this is the cost that the Diocese charges for the newspaper.

Purchase of services-Talentage employees and other services

Other includes social events, banking fees, computer hardware, candles, flowers, advertising and missalettes etc..

Non Operational Income 2023-2024

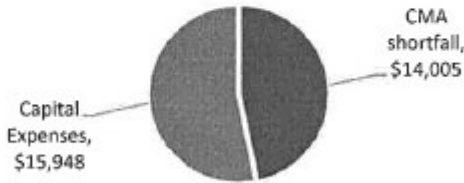


Change in Investment, \$258,539
