





Census

The Diocese of Rochester is currently in the process of carrying out a census initiative. The purpose of this census is to gather accurate and up-to-date information about all our registered parishioners, as well as those Catholics not yet registered in our parishes. By conducting this comprehensive survey and obtaining accurate contact information, we aim to strengthen pastoral care, stewardship, and enhance communication by having a reliable means of informing you about events, programs, ministries, and greater opportunities for spiritual growth at your parish and throughout the Diocese.

Kindly be assured that all information provided will be handled with the utmost confidentiality. The data collected will be used solely for pastoral, stewardship, and communication purposes.

Over the next few weeks, every Catholic in the Diocese will be asked to participate in the census. In the coming days, you will receive an email with a link asking you to complete the digital census. This email is not spam, and I encourage you to complete it. Should you feel uncomfortable completing the census shared in the email, we will have opportunities over the next few weeks to complete the census form before and after mass in digital or paper format. Digital and census forms will be available at both churches. If you need help filling it out, we will have people to help you fill out the census in pew on October 12 & 13. I encourage your participation.

Doing Our Part for the Common Good (Part One in a Series on the Election and NYS Proposal One 2024)

In today's first reading (Numbers 11:25) we read, "Taking some of the spirit that was on Moses, the Lord bestowed it on the seventy elders; and as the spirit came to rest of them, they prophesized." In Baptism we receive the Holy Spirit and are sealed with the Spirit at Confirmation. We need to allow the Holy Spirit to guide us when we vote.

In their statement on NYS Proposal 1 to amend our NYS Constitution, our NYS Bishops write, "we must participate in the public square for the sake of the common good. Every Catholic is called to do the work of properly informing his or her conscience" (https://www.nyscatholic.org/posts/proposal-1-wolf-sheeps-clothing, cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1913-1915).

Pope Francis recently spoke of how the presidential candidates for both major parties are against life. In NYS, we have Proposal 1 to change our state constitution. In the coming weeks, we will have a series of articles on the election and life.



OUR PARISH'S SUPPORT AND SUPPORTING OUR PARISH

A couple calls St. Francis and St. Clare Parish because they want to get their child baptized. Then the parish provides ways to help the couple celebrate the baptism of their child and continue to pass along the treasure of our faith. St. Francis and St. Clare Parish has been there to support these parishioners at this joyful time. Another family brings their child to the parish to receive the Sacraments of First Holy Communion, Confirmation or Reconciliation. The faith formation leader and catechists of St. Francis and St. Clare Parish prepare these children and young people for sacraments that will sustain them throughout their lifetime, St. Francis and St. Clare Parish has been there to support them.

There are often calls from one of the hospitals that one of the parishioners of St. Francis and St. Clare Parish is in their hospital. The pastor makes a pastoral visit to the hospital. They do this to ensure that each parishioner may receive Holy Communion or the Anointing of the Sick during such a time of suffering, fear, and uncertainty because St. Francis and St. Clare Parish believes in supporting them during such a difficult period of their lives.

There are a number of parishioners of St. Francis and St. Clare Parish who are unable to attend Mass; the Mass is streamed each weekend and there are compassionate individuals who seek to offer the presence of St. Francis and St. Clare Parish Faith Community when these parishioners are homebound. When designated parishioners visit a person in their home, they bring the presence of Christ and the fellowship of St. Francis and St. Clare Parish to them. These visits allow the homebound to feel connected to their parish because **St. Francis and St. Clare Parish has been there to support them**.

Parishioners may find themselves or a family member entering one of the area nursing homes. The pastor or a parishioner goes to visit those residents. It helps those who are visited to know they are cared for, are being prayed for and are still connected to St. Francis and St. Clare Parish. Those nursing home parishioners know that they have not been forgotten because **St. Francis and St. Clare Parish has been there to support them**.

There have been many funerals in St. Francis and St. Clare Parish over the years. When the loss of a loved one happens, someone from the staff contacts the family to see how the parish community can be of help, especially in planning the funeral liturgy. Then the pastor provides the comfort of the Eucharistic liturgy for the family who has experienced this painful loss. It is another wonderful example of how St. Francis and St. Clare Parish has been there to support them in this very difficult time.

Whether it is being nourished by the Eucharist and God's Word (as well as the homily) at daily or one of the weekend Masses or a myriad of other ways St. Francis and St. Clare Parish has been there to support you. St. Francis and St. Clare Parish Faith Community now seeks your support. Without the support of the Catholic Ministries Appeal, that helps provide the resources and infrastructure to maintain and help grow our parish, St. Francis and St. Clare Parish, we would not be able to continue any of our ministries. EVERY parish household is being asked to contribute. 
