

All Saints Day-All Souls Day

Each November, the Church celebrates two feast days, which are related to each other. All Saints' Day is a solemnity celebrated on November 1st. There will be a vigil Mass on Thursday, Oct 31st at 5:30 at St. Mary's as well as the Mass on the 1st at St. Patrick's at 8:30am. On this day we celebrate the great Communion of Saints, which includes those holy men and women who have passed before us but have not been canonized. All Souls' Day is celebrated on November 2nd and is a day to remember and pray for all those who have died.

Seeking to See as God Sees (Part Five in a Series on the Election and NYS Proposal One 2024)

In today's gospel (Mark 10:46-52), a blind man named Bartimeaus comes to Jesus and says, "Master, I want to see.

Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way."

We need to pray for God to give us spiritual eyesight to see his truth. There are people today who say there is no universal truth. They are called relativists. Yet, there is truth and it will set you free (John 8:32). God is the source of this truth. The supporters of NYS Proposal 1 are people who identify as "pro-choice." Yet, there is no allowance for conscientious objection by healthcare workers who are told abortions and gender transition surgeries must be offered to anyone who wants them. As we come to the close the Right to Life month I am reminded of a recent document *Declaration of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith "Dignitas Infinita"* on Human Dignity. The declaration enumerates "grave violations of human dignity" (33–62). Without claiming to be exhaustive, the document lists offenses against human dignity found in the contemporary world. They include extreme poverty (36–37), war (38–39), maltreatment of migrants (40), human trafficking (41–42), sexual abuse (43), violence against women (44–46), abortion (47), surrogacy (48–50), euthanasia and assisted suicide (51–52), marginalization of people with disabilities (53–54), gender theory (55–59), sex change (60), and digital violence (61–62).

The document's conclusion "ardently urges that *respect for the dignity of the human person beyond all circumstances* be placed at the center of the commitment to the common good and at the center of every legal system" (64). It further states that both individuals and communities are responsible for fostering human dignity (65). It therefore concludes with a <u>quote from Pope Francis</u>: "I appeal to everyone throughout the world not to forget this dignity which is ours. No one has the right to take it from us" (66).

Voting

Don't forget to vote if you haven't already. We vote because we are citizens. But we vote conscientiously because we are people of faith. Our consciences are formed through studying Scripture and the teachings of the Church, examination of the facts, and prayerful reflection. According to the USCCB we need to remember three things:

- 1. Respect for the dignity of each person is the core of Catholic social and moral teaching. This is our most basic principle.
- 2. We focus on the common good, not our own personal interests. We ask, how can we make the world a better place? Not, how can I improve my own personal situation?
- 3. We have a responsibility—a true obligation—to form our consciences and participate in the civic life of this nation.


