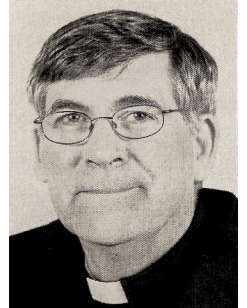

- This calls us to social justice to service those in need and to work together for God and one another



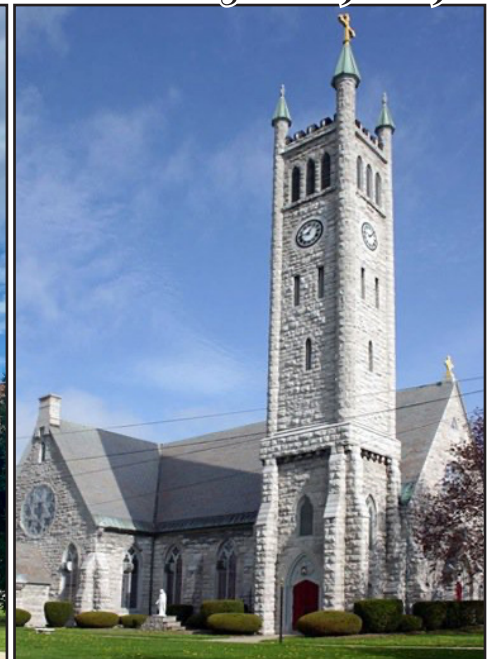

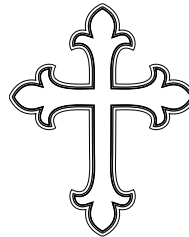
