Now that we are in Ordinary Time, there are still many people who strive to keep our church clean and maintained so that we can continue with prayerful liturgies. This week, St. Mary's will switch back to taking up the collection. #### Baptism of the Lord

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season. This feast is a celebration of who Christ is. The following, from the preface for the Baptism of the Lord states:

For in the waters of the Jordan

you revealed with signs and wonders a new Baptism,

so that through the voice that came down from heaven

we might come to believe in your Word dwelling among us,

and by the Spirit's descending in the likeness of a dove

we might know that Christ your Servant

has been anointed with the oil of gladness

and sent to bring the good news to the poor.

This short text has references to numerous Scripture passages that speak to who Jesus is. The first three lines speak of what we hear in the Gospel for the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, referring to the voice of God telling who Jesus is, the Son of God. The "Word dwelling among us" is from the prologue of John that speaks of the Incarnation. Calling Jesus "your Servant" refers to the four Servant Songs of Isaiah that speak of a suffering servant who saves his people. The "oil of gladness" is from the Old Testament. The phrase, " bring good news to the poor," is from Isaiah and is spoken by Jesus in chapter 4 of Luke when he refers to his mission. Knowing that Jesus is the promised Savior gives comfort to us in difficult times.

#### Spirituality of the Prayers at Mass EUCHARISTIC PRAYER II

#### Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray,

It is because God is Holy himself that he can then make the gifts Holy. The gifts are to be made Holy in the same way that God himself is Holy; they are to made into the very presence of God. **by sending your Spirit upon them** 

As these words are said the priest puts his hands over the gifts of bread and wine. The coming of the spirit is seen a number of times in Scripture. In Gen 1:1 God's spirit comes upon the water and gives life. In the story of the baptism of Jesus we hear *"it happened in those days that Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased'"Mk 1:9-11 The Spirit also descends upon the disciples at Pentecost-Acts 2:1-4. The Holy Spirit is God's love which changes all that it touches. There are many other examples of the Spirit affecting healing and designating people for certain tasks, Luke 4:40, Acts 9-17. and Acts13:1-3, just to mention a few.*
